TEN COMMANDMENTS LITURGY

Leader: "I am the Lord your God who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery; you shall have no other gods before me."

People: We worship other gods of money, power, pleasure, careers. Forgive us, Lord.

Leader: "You shall not make for yourself an idol, whether in the form of anything that is in heaven above, or that is under the earth. You shall not bow down to them or worship them."

People: God, we confess that we make images of things that we love, possessions such as our homes, cars, clothing, our social standing. Pardon our sin, Lord.

Leader: "You shall not make wrongful use of the Name of the Lord."

People: We repent that we have used the Lord's name in vain by swearing, blaming God when things don't go our way, and not witnessing to others or exercising our gifts to God's glory.

Leader: "Remember the Sabbath day and keep it holy."

People: We have sinned by engaging in activities that detract from the sacredness of the Sabbath, not worshipping God regularly, and not spending enough time learning about God.

Leader: "Honor your father and your mother."

People: We have failed to let our parents know we love them and seek their wisdom, to care for aging parents, and pray for them each day. We've neglected to teach our children respect for

their elders and all those in authority.

Leader: "You shall not murder."

People: We have evil thoughts of others and have repeated lies and gossip. We have not worked for peace but have created disharmony in the lives of our neighbors. We have let our anger get out of control instead of relying on God to exact justice. Forgive us, Lord.

Leader: "You shall not commit adultery."

People: Lord, we have committed adultery in our hearts through lustful thoughts, desires and looks. We have not fought against pornography and all sins against the dignity of others. Forgive our sin, O Lord.

Leader: "You shall not steal."

People: We repent that we haven't shared our wealth with others and have become insensitive to their needs. We have cheated others out of what is rightfully theirs; robbing them of their time, health or happiness.

Leader: "You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor."
