READ 1 Corinthians 10:23-11:1

1. Read verse 23 & 24 out of several versions of the Bible. As a group explain this passage in your own words.

²³ "All things are lawful," but not all things are helpful. "All things are lawful," but not all things build up. ²⁴ Let no one seek his own good, but the good of his neighbor. -ESV ²³ All things are lawful for me, but all things are not expedient: all things are lawful for me, but all things edify not. ²⁴ Let no man seek his own, but every man another's wealth. KJV

 - a. What might be some parallel issues today to the eating of meat?
- 3. Answer Paul's question in vs. 29. "Why should my freedom be judged by another's conscience?
- 4. What is the difference between stumbling and being offended?
 - a. How do we deal with the situation of "everyone being offended by everything?"
 - b. How has the standard of judging something as offensive changed during your lifetime?
- 5. What are some issues that should be stumbling blocks?
- 6. When have you curtailed your own freedom to support someone else in their faith?
 - a. Are their currently freedoms you are practicing that you should curtail because they might cause someone else to stumble?
