WEECOME TO WORSHIP AT IMMANUEL

Pastor Kevin Muyskens May 19, 2024

Morning Worship: The LORD as the Good Shepherd appears next in the book of the Prophet Zechariah which is set 70 years or so after Ezekiel and Jeremiah, in the time when some of the Jews returned from exile to Jerusalem and rebuilt the temple. Zechariah adds two key pieces to the Good Shepherd material: first, that the Good Shepherd will transform the humble sheep into a warhorse that brings glory to the LORD, and second, that the LORD will not only gather from those taken to Babylon, but from his people scattered all over the earth. This looks ahead to Revelation's picture of God's church including people of every tongue, tribe, and nation.

Evening Worship: Tonight, we will look at the first section of Genesis 18 where Abraham plays host to the LORD and receives the promise that within the year 90-year-old Sarah will have a son. In response to this prediction Sarah laughs and then denies having done so. What does it mean that God's promise is received with both hospitality and laughter?
